MESSAGE FROM OUR CHAIRMAN



Dear Members,

Who could ever have envisaged the events that have unfolded during 2020! Covid-19 has raged at pandemic proportions through the world and arrested our normality. It has played havoc with the social and competitive events that we attend with our much-loved Golden Retrievers. These are not just dog shows but social opportunities and mean so much to most exhibitors. I am sure that there is now a big dichotomy for most of our members: the wanting and needing to get back out there and the big worry about how this infection will continue as a threat to our lives and wellbeing. Personally, I hope that we can see some events soon. It is with a heavy heart that as a committee we decided to postpone the Championship Show. We are hoping that if all goes well we will be able to hold it with the open show next summer, should things have settled by then and it is safe for the Committee and exhibitors to be attending shows then.

We were lucky to get our AGM in January, but then to lose the open show that was due to be held in the spring, this was in the middle of lock down and as a result we had to cancel.

To offer our members some events we are in the process of organising an online show, Lesley Layland will be announcing this soon. I have also arranged a webinar with Mrs Val Foss on the History of the Golden Retriever, this is being co-hosted with the Retriever Club of Portugal. I do hope if you are interested that you will sign up for the event. It will be held on 11th October 2020. Information about registration will follow soon and be available on the FB page and Website, so keep your eyes open.

The club has had two significant members and supporters passed away since our last newsletter:

George White (Shamborne) died on 9th May 2020. He had served as a committee member of MGRC for many years. He was Vice Chairman and after he decided to step down from this position due to health problems he then served as Vice President. He attended shows with his wife Hazel, and they had some nice winning stock. I will remember their kennel most for their lovely Sh Ch Shambourne Bettina. They were very well known in the Midlands area. Unfortunately, Hazel died some years ago and I know how much George missed her. George attended fewer shows and canine events and gradually as his health failed, he withdrew from the canine world. The last time I saw him was at our Open Show in 2019 where he was quite frail. Our thoughts are with his family.

Mervin Philpott (Westley) was a great supporter of MGRC particularly on the working side, running training classes and other working events on behalf of the club. Mervin was such a generous, good hearted man, he made many donations to the club and the rescue funds and was always so willing to step forward and help the club. Despite being unwell and near the end of his life Mervin was still thinking of us and donating rosettes for the working test from his care home. Mervin's death leaves MGRC without any working representation and it is truly a great blow to the club and to the breed; there is now such a divide between the working and show side that seems to be drifting ever further apart.

2020 has been a hard year in many ways not just the Covid-19 infection, many have had to deal with the death and illness associated with this. All of us have faced the isolation and difficulties that has brought on our personal and canine life. I know my own dogs have been even more important to me in these times and given me a focus and friendship. The loss of the AHT is a significant blow to the whole dog world. The research they were doing could only have positive offshoots for dogs and their owners.

The number of enquiries for puppies has also been worrying, I am sure that many unscrupulous breeders are charging elevated prices and those desperate are paying. What will happen to these poor puppies, they must have lacked socialization in their critical years, so I am sure we will see adults with behavioural problems. Also, what will happen when people go back to work and leave a dog that has never been on its own? Separation anxiety can be very difficult to deal with. When furlough comes to an end many people will lose their jobs, what will then happen to their pets if they cannot afford them? I think we will see many coming through rescue either through unemployment or because of behaviour issues.

I hope as the year draws to a close that we can all look for a brighter 2021. I wish you good health and happiness and that you stay safe and well and we look forward to seeing everyone in the near future.

In January 2020 I was privileged to have my first Championship Show judging appointment, which I enjoyed immensely and I am now on the Kennel Club AI Judging List.



If you are selling a litter, please vet your potential families very carefully, discuss the future and the risk of unemployment, as well as the cost of keeping a large dog. Ensure that they realise fully that with the current situation puppy rearing will need extra effort to socialise and train their youngster, and this is a single opportunity to get the



socialisation phase right. The puppy also needs to learn to be on its own for periods of time, otherwise leaving it alone in the future may be problematic.

We are in uncertain times and when we sell a puppy we must make every effort we can to ensure it goes to a happy, forever home, but with the unprecedented Covid pandemic, none of us can be certain of the future.

PUMPKIN AND APPLE TREATS

- 1 cup pureed pumpkin
- 4 cups oatmeal
- 1 apple (remove core and seeds)
- 1 ego

Grate the apple and mix with ground oatmeal, stir in the pumpkin and egg. Roll out the dough to about ½ inch thickness and cut into shapes with a pastry cutter.

Preheat oven to 400 F

Place shapes onto a lined baking sheet and bake for 12 – 15 minutes.

GINGERBREAD BITES

- 3 cups whole wheat flour
- 2 thisp ground ginger
- 1 tsp ground cinnamon
- 1/2 cup honey
- 1/2 cup warm water
- 1/4 cup olive oil

Mix together the flour, ginger and cinnamon then stir in the honey, water and oil until thoroughly mixed.

Preheat oven to 325 F, 160 C

Roll out the dough to about ½ inch thickness and cut into shapes. Lightly spray a baking sheet and place shapes on baking sheet. Bake for 20 minutes.
